American Express Centurion Lounge Coming to PHL

PHILADELPHIA, PA – American Express will bring its signature airport lounge program to Philadelphia International Airport (PHL) with the opening of a new Centurion Lounge in Terminal A-West later this year.

The new 6,300-square-foot Centurion Lounge is set to open in August. It will offer amenities such as a complimentary premium bar and food menu featuring a selection of local Philadelphia favorites, floor-to-ceiling windows with expansive internal and external views, a private shower suite, and noise-buffering workspaces.

“We are delighted to welcome the American Express Centurion Lounge to our family of clubs and lounges at PHL,” said Airport CEO Chellie Cameron. “It will be another wonderful place where our passengers can spend quality time relaxing or working as they wait to board their flight.”

With the addition of the Centurion Lounge, Philadelphia Airport will host a total of 9 clubs and lounges. This includes: 4 American Airlines Admirals Clubs in Terminals A-West, A-East, the B/C Connector, and the F Hub; the British Airways Galleries Lounge in Terminal A-West; the United Club in the C/D Link; and the Delta Sky Club in Terminal D. There is also the Liberty USO Lounge, for active and retired American military personnel, located in Terminal A-East.
