Frontier Airlines Announces 10 New Destinations from PHL Airport

PHILADELPHIA – Frontier Airlines, which touts its “Low Fares Done Right” service, will substantially increase its presence at Philadelphia International Airport (PHL) this spring. Today, Frontier announced it will add nonstop service from PHL to 10 cities – including 2 currently not served from Philadelphia.

Travelers flying from PHL will be able to fly Frontier to New Orleans, Raleigh-Durham and Indianapolis starting April 14; Nashville, Cleveland and St. Augustine, FL starting April 15; Cincinnati on May 13; Austin, TX on May 15; and Kansas City and Milwaukee on June 2.

St. Augustine and Austin are destinations currently not served from PHL. Cleveland, Kansas City, Milwaukee, New Orleans and Indianapolis are presently served only by one carrier, American Airlines. Cincinnati (American, Delta Air Lines), Nashville (American, Southwest Airlines), and Raleigh-Durham (American, Delta) are served by multiple carriers.

The new service will double Frontier’s presence at PHL to 22 cities. Presently, Frontier flies nonstop to 11 cities from Philadelphia with year-round service to Orlando, Cancun, Fort Myers, Miami, Tampa, Punta Cana, and Montego Bay, and seasonal service to Atlanta, Houston, Charlotte and Chicago. On March 17, Frontier will begin nonstop flights between PHL and the airline’s home base in Denver.

Since December 2014, Frontier has launched service to 10 cities from PHL.

“This is exciting news to passengers in the Philadelphia region,” said Airport CEO Chellie Cameron. “When competition increases, this typically translates to lower fares and makes flying a more attractive and affordable option. Moreover, travelers will have convenient flights to St. Augustine, which is a new destination from PHL, and Austin, which previously had been served by another carrier. We are very pleased by Frontier’s commitment to Philadelphia and look forward to more flights to more cities.”

Frontier’s flights from PHL to Austin, Kansas City, Milwaukee, New Orleans, and Raleigh will operate Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday; flights to Cincinnati, Cleveland, Nashville, and St. Augustine will run Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday.

Philadelphia International Airport is owned and operated by the City of Philadelphia. The Airport is a self-sustaining entity that operates without the use of local tax dollars. It is one of the largest economic engines in Pennsylvania, generating an estimated \$14.4 billion in spending to the regional economy and accounting for more than 141,000 jobs.
